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## News from the desk of the Principal, Jeanene Sampson:

Second semester is off and running. Please remember to check our website and facebook accounts for updates on daily announcements, calendars, etc.

## A few key reminders for this newsletter timeframe:

A. Parent Teacher Conferences are scheduled for February 10th and 11th. Confirmation slips will be sent home the week of February 3-7. The time you scheduled for September conferences will be the time that is automatically scheduled for February conferences. You will have the option to call and reschedule if your options have changed. Open house is also available on February 11th where you can see any and all teachers on your student's schedule. Also remember that if your scheduled conference is on February 10th - ALL EXPLORATORY TEACHERS ARE AVAILABLE WITHOUT SCHEDULING AN APPOINTMENT.
B. The registration process has started for the 2014-2015 school year. At this point students have brought their first round registration sheets home and the verification sheets (what your student will be taking) will be sent home with you at conferences.
C. Iowa Assessments - Each year our 6th-8th grade students take standardized tests that assess their academic strengths and weaknesses in reading, math and science. Our lowa Assessments have come a long way in two years by truly assessing each student's level of achievement against the lowa Core Curriculum. The lowa Assessment is scheduled to be given March 24th - April 4th. Our building schedule has not yet been determined, but once it has been we will post on the website. Attendance is essential during our testing sessions along with effort. Many situations come up that use lowa Assessment scores for placement with students: scheduling, high school schedule, intervention supports, enrichment courses, TA, etc. This is why we need every family to support our efforts in expecting each student to "shoot for the stars" during lowa Assessments.

The fundraiser profit has been spent on many building projects to support students and staff. Some of the items in recent years are:
