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## Important Immunization Requirement for Middle School

The State of lowa now requires a TDAP vaccination for all students entering $7^{\text {th }}$ grade. Tdap is a booster vaccine for older children, adolescents, and adults. It safely protects against 3 dangerous diseases: tetanus, diphtheria, and whooping cough (also called pertussis).

This requirement will help protect your child and others in school and the community from whooping cough. In 2012, whooping cough was widespread in the United States and in lowa with approximately $417 \%$ more persons with pertussis disease compared to the average of the past 5 years. (Iowa Department of Public Health)

All $7^{\text {th }}$ grade students will need to provide proof of receiving the Tdap vaccination before enrolling for school in August 2014. Many students may have already received this immunization. Please be sure to provide the school with an updated immunization record if your student has already received the immunization or if they receive it during this school year. Records may be faxed to North Middle at 277-5941.

## Wellness Tip: Vegetable Tips for Children

- Set a good example for children by eating vegetables with meals and as snacks. Let children decide on the dinner vegetables or what goes into salads.
- Depending on their age, children can help shop for, clean, peel, or cut up vegetables.
- Allow children to pick a new vegetable to try while shopping.
- Use cut-up vegetables as part of afternoon snacks.

- Children often prefer foods served separately. So, rather than mixed vegetables try serving two vegetables separately.
